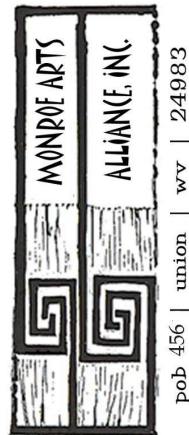

Meet Board Member Bettye Ragland-Earley

Bettye Ragland-Earley, president of New Language Art (NLA) and Satellite Gallery (found both online and at Yesterday's Thrift Shop, Union), is a recognized art consultant and artist representative specializing in contemporary artists. She founded the company in 1994 with her husband, Donald, a renowned artist and art professor. The company provides a professional, personalized approach – whether for exhibiting a single painting or developing an entire collection, that promotes an enhanced specific image.

Her background includes over 18 years in sales/marketing management and seven years as Executive Director of Appraisal Management with The Aronson Art Group International, Nashville, TN. Bettye was actively involved in the Nashville arts community -- serving three years as President of the Nashville African-American Arts Association and as a grant panelist for the Metro Nashville Arts Commission from 1999 to 2006. She also served on the board of directors for The Madison Art Center, Tennessee Artists Guild and has been a member of the National Museum of Women in the Arts since 1998.

Since moving to Greenville, Bettye serves on the boards of the Monroe Arts Alliance and the Hans Creek CEOS. She is a member of the Greenville Ruritan Club and the Centerville Presbyterian Church. "When Donald and I were searching for a home in the country we happened upon Greenville. We've found that Monroe County's friendly community spirit and relaxed atmosphere, makes our scenic artist's paradise a wonderful place to call home. We love it here! It's a much better place to live with friendlier people. We enjoy looking up at night and seeing the stars, rather than the haze we left in Nashville."



Notes from the Treasurer

The Monroe Arts Alliance received its corporation status from the State of West Virginia on July 6, 2001.

The application for tax exempt status was begun and we received an advance ruling granting the 501 C-3 status backdated to the incorporation date. The five year advance ruling ended in 2005 and we were required to submit financial reports for the ruling period.

Permanent ruling was received on March 28, 2006. For several years before this, the Monroe Arts Alliance was in existence on an informal basis, offering programs to the community and working with the Monroe Art Gallery.

Once we received our charitable organization status, we began soliciting funds for scholarships in the arts. From January 1, 2003 through July 31, 2007, the MAA has received scholarship donations for the disciplines in the amounts listed below:
